The Board of Education of the Berkley School District is conducting a comprehensive search for its next Superintendent. The expected start date for the new Superintendent is July 1, 2021.

Since 1840, the Berkley School District has been committed to the excellence of education for our students. Today, the district is made up of a childcare/early education center, four elementary schools, one middle school, one high school and one International Baccalaureate World School (K-8). Our students may also opt to attend the International Academy, a magnet, International Baccalaureate public high school; The Center for Advanced Studies and the Arts (CASA), a consortium school for high school students for which Berkley serves as the fiduciary; or participate in vocational education offered via the Oakland Schools Technical Campus. In addition, the Berkley School District serves students with special needs from birth through age 26.

Berkley School District's 500 staff members serve more than 4,500 students ranging in age from newborn through adulthood for people living in Berkley, Huntington Woods and a section of north Oak Park. Additionally, we host a limited number of students from neighboring communities who participate in the state's Schools of Choice program. Our annual operating budget is \$65 million, with a foundation allowance of \$8,500 per pupil and a fund balance projected at \$9 million.

Our district is located in Oakland County, Michigan. In addition to its close proximity to world-class museums, concert venues, theater and professional sporting events, Berkley affords easy access to major expressways, parks, lakes, and recreational facilities.
