

First Bell: 8:00am


Instructional Start: 8:05am

Full Day Dismissal: 3:15pm (TK/Kinder 3:05pm-3:10pm)



Mouning ROUTINES



- Students will learn to unpack independently. Each student will have their own locker!
- They start their morning with Morning Announcements and say the Pledge of Allegiance
- Morning message and calendar help with foundational math concepts and shared writing experiences.






Mouning ROUTINES



- Reading, Writing, and Phonics are in the morning to help grow their reading muscles!
- Exploration Stations-take turns, problem solve, make friends, and share
- Morning recess is time to play and explore!











- Kindergarteners/TK join in the cafeteria for lunch.
- They can bring their lunch or have school lunch.
 - 4 different lunch items that are served
 - (TBD if lunch is free next year)
- Lunch aides are there to help the littles.
- Students have outside recess time with the lunch aides after they eat.





Afternoon ROUTINES

- Math
 - Math talk promotes deep learning and understanding and gets the children talking about their thinking.
- Afternoon recess helps to get the wiggles out.


