For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given one of these labels.

Burton Elementary is committed to providing appropriate learning opportunities that will motivate and challenge all students. We follow the District's mission to encourage and support each and every learner in the quest to realize their potential. Our goal is to move all our proficient students into the advanced category when assessed. We plan to accomplish this goal by adding support to students through differentiated instruction, added support with instructional support teachers and offering additional tutoring at lunch and after school for specific student needs.

All students who live in Huntington Woods attend Burton Elementary. We also house the elementary programs for students with autism for the entire District.

Our goal is to move proficient students in to an advanced category.
