Dear Norup families and students,

Today your child had a visit in class where we held a discussion about the idea of taking action, so I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself to you as well. My name is Jennifer Wilcox and I am the new International Baccalaureate (IB) Coordinator for Norup International. I am here to support you, your child, and your child's teacher in the IB Primary Years Program (PYP).

You may be wondering, "What does this mean?" Your child has the opportunity to be a part of a curriculum that encourages lifelong learners and a vision to make the world a better place. This is done through dedicated teachers that have a love for learning and a true passion to see your child become their best possible self. We are lucky to have those teachers here at Norup!

The IB PYP has five essential elements.

- Agency
- Skills
- Knowledge
- Concepts
- Action

<u>Agency</u> are taught to help give your child the power of being a well-rounded person. There are 12 words we teach your child how to be a good person and student. These include empathy, independence, curious, appreciative, creative, cooperative, integrity, commitment, enthusiasm, confidence, and respect.

<u>Skills</u> give your child life skills to be successful in the classroom and in life. These include social, self-management, research, communication, and thinking skills. When your child understands how to utilize these skills they can function extremely well in groups, independently, and focus on a task.

<u>Knowledge</u> consists of all of the subjects taught in your student's class and in specials. These include *math*, *science*, *reading*, *writing*, *word study*, *social studies*, *World Language*, *Physical Education*, *Art*, *and Music*.

<u>Concepts</u> give your child a wide range of ways to investigate a topic and/or understand an individual. We have eight key questions that students can use to learn about something or someone new. These questions include the following:

### **Key Concepts**

**Function:** How does this work?

Form: What is it?

Causation: Why is it like this? Change: How has it changed?

**Connection:** How is this connected to other things?

**Perspective:** What are the points of view? **Responsibility:** What is our responsibility?

**Reflection:** How do we know?

Last but not least...

<u>Action</u> makes us as a school extremely unique. Students are often asked to solve a problem or make the world a better place.

Ask yourself-Have you done something? Picked up? Turned off? Given? Helped?

This year Norup continues to reflect and work on our IB Units. Through this continuous cycle of reflection, we strive to create global minded students. I am passionate about the work we do in Berkley with the IB PYP.
