Graduation Requirements & Grade Point Average

Graduation Requirements

Twenty two credits are required for graduation from Berkley High School. All courses are worth 0.5 credit. Students are required to meet the following minimum department requirements:

English: 4 Credits Social Studies: 3 Credits Physical Ed/Health: 1 Credit
Math: 4 Credits World Language: 2 Credits Visual/Performing Arts: 1 Credit
Science: 3 Credits

Grade Point Average

The grade point average on a transcript is weighted if a student has taken an Advanced Placement (AP) course and/or select honors (HON) courses. A "G" grade indicates a passing grade in a pass/fail option. The lowest grade one can earn and still receive credit is a D-.

COVID-19 Grade Adjustments - Second Semester 2020

Due to the mandated school closure by the Governor's Executive Order, Berkley High School students were taught in a virtual environment from March 13 through June 12, 2020. During that time period, letter grades were issued to students based upon the quality of participation and engagement in virtual classes, assignments and assessments. For one semester only, the grading scale was adjusted to meet the unique needs of students and families adjusting to the "Stay at Home" order. The grading scale was adjusted as follows for only semester two of the 2019-20 school year:

A: 90-100% B+: 80-84.9% B-: 70-74.9% C: 60-64.9%
A-: 85.89.9% B: 75-79.9% C+: 65-69.9% G: Below 60%

COVID-19 Grade Adjustments - 2020-21 School Year

For the first semester of the 2020-21 school year, students who earned a 50-69.4% in their course received a credit ("G" grade). Students who demonstrated mastery of semester two material in a year-long course received a credit ("G" grade) for the accompanying semester one course.
