



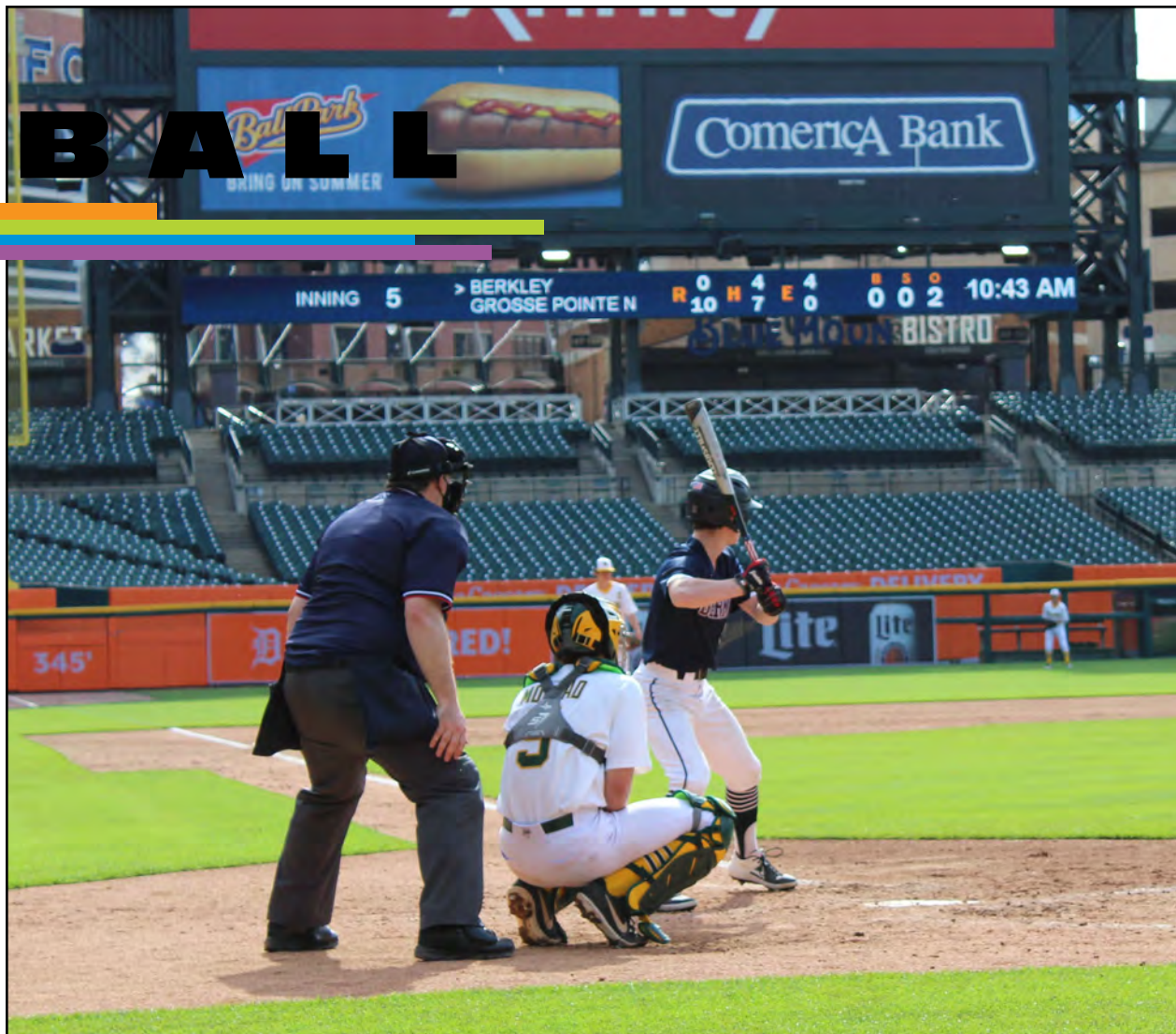
BACK TO THE

VARSITY BASEBALL

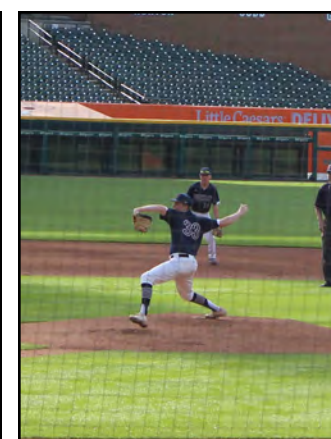

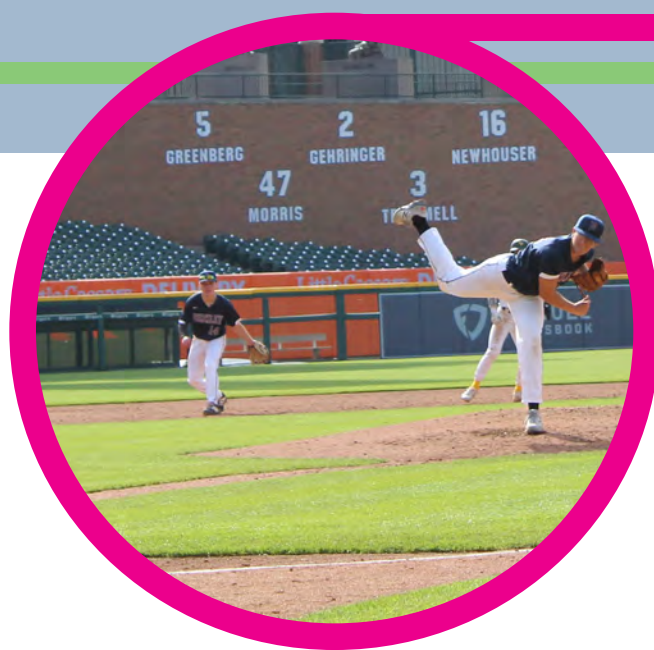

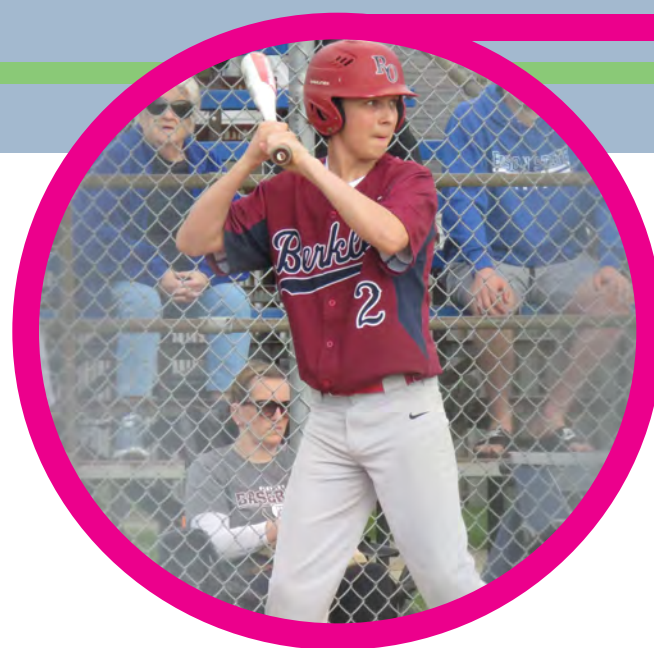
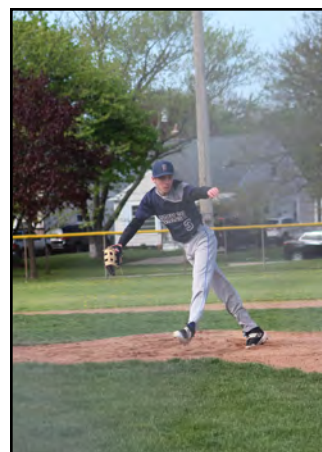


JV & FRESHMAN BASEBALL

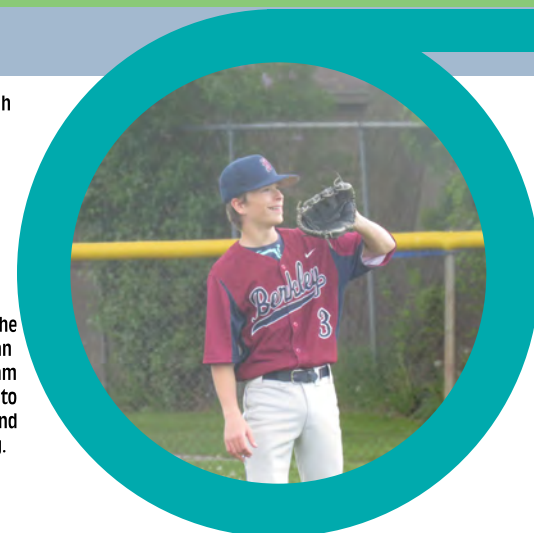

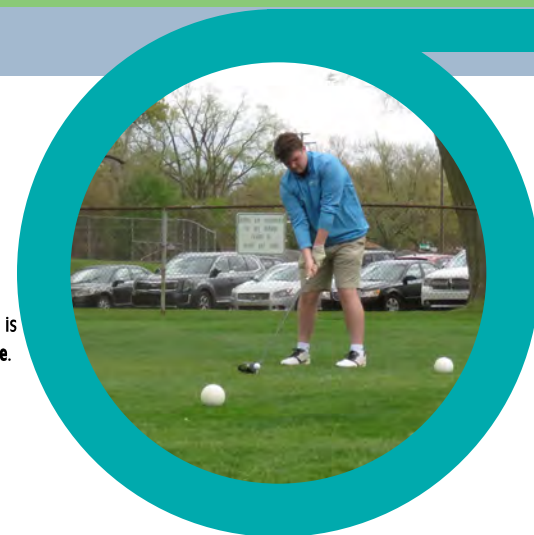
BOYS VARSITY/JV GOLF

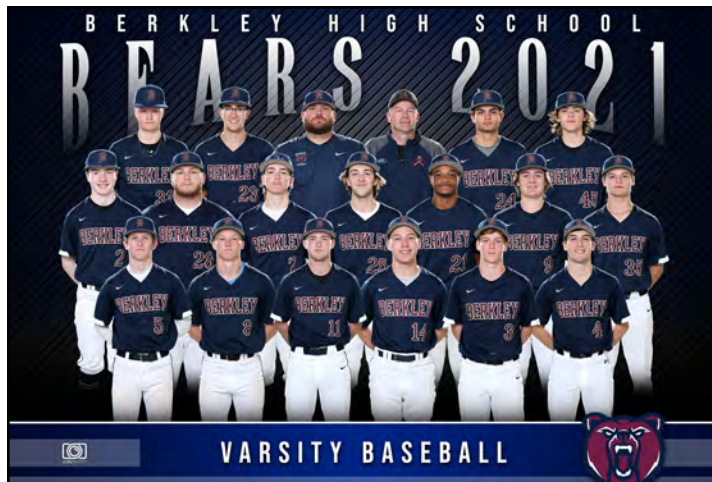

MAMA MIA

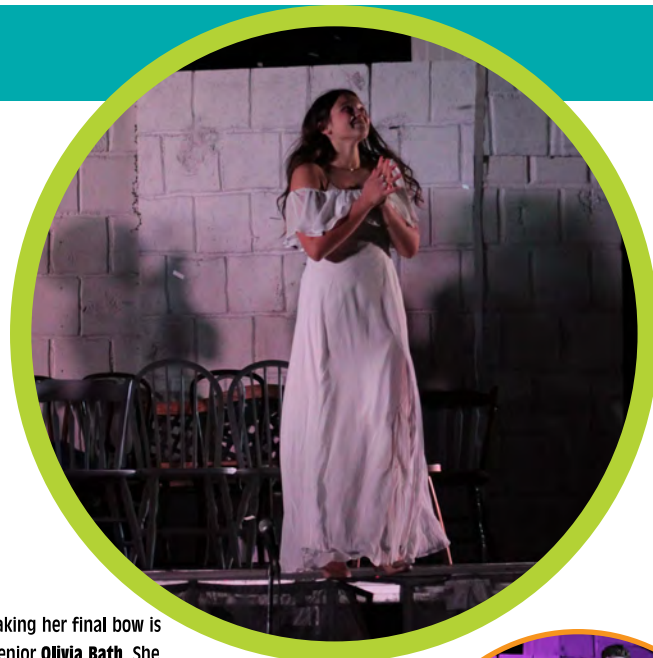

In the East Gym, Berkley ensemble is singing backup for "Dancing Queen." The play was moved to the gym on opening day because of the weather.

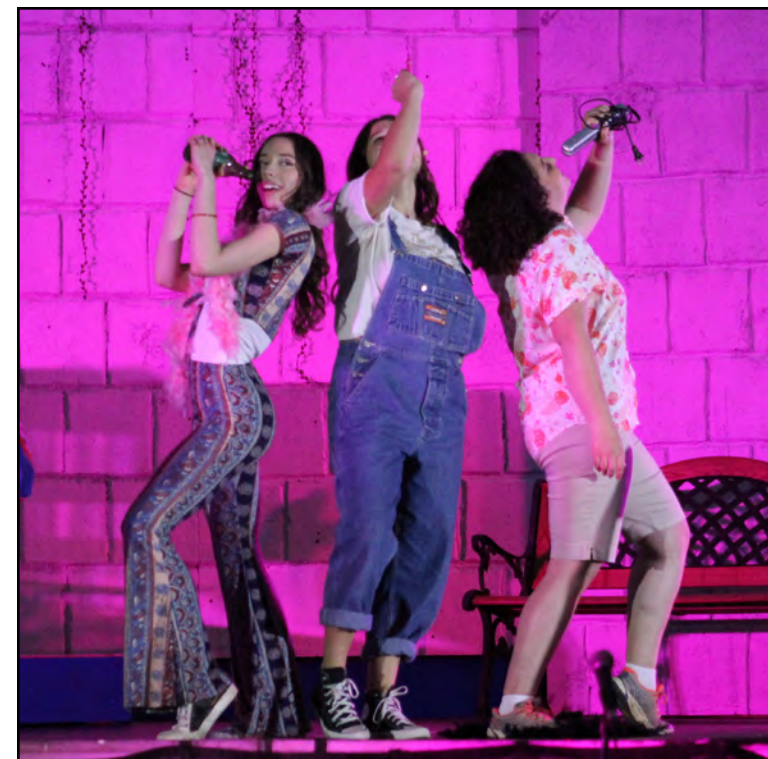
